Assurance of Pardoning Grace: The Bethlehem Candle - Scott & Sharyn Moore

Why do we light the Advent candles?

Jesus said, "I am the light of the world. He who follows me will not walk in darkness but will have the Light of Life."

What is the meaning of the second lighted candle?

The second candle is the Bethlehem candle whose light bears witness to the Savior, the only Mediator between God and Man, who was born in Bethlehem.

Peter says,

"Know that you were ransomed from the futile ways inherited from your forefathers, not with perishable things such as silver or gold, but with the precious blood of Christ, like that of a lamb without blemish or spot. He was foreknown before the foundation of the world but was made manifest in the last times for the sake of you who through him are believers in God, who raised him from the dead and gave him glory, so that your faith and hope are in God."

What does the gospel say about this Mediator born in Bethlehem? From the Gospel of John,

"So Jesus said to them . . . I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. For this reason the Father loves me, because I lay down my life that I may take it up again. No one takes it from me, but I lay it down of my own accord. I have authority to lay it down, and I have authority to take it up again. This charge I have received from my Father."
