—— Prayers for Our City——

Praying for REST. ... Hebrews 4:1-13 Sovereign Lord, who rested on the seventh day, I bring before you ...

Mon: Busyness in the city — "Let us, therefore, make every effort to enter that rest" (v 11).

From weekend getaways to new experiences, so much of our culture's pursuit of leisure is really a misplaced desire for the perfect rest of the new creation. Give thanks for this ultimate rest that is promised to you in Christ. Pray for yourself and others you care about to "make every effort to enter" it through faith in Christ.

Tues: Sundays in the city — "There remains then a Sabbath-rest for the people of God" (v 9).

Give thanks for God's provision of a day of rest every week—a foretaste of the rest that we will one day fully enjoy in God's presence. Pray that each week you would rest not only by stopping work, but by "recreation" through listening to God's word. Pray that God's people would prioritize meeting together on Sunday to do this.

Wed: Rest in the city — "For anyone who enters God's rest also rests from their works, just as God did from his" (v 10).

Despite a huge leisure industry and many labor saving innovations, city life is often fraught and busy. Pray that, as someone who ahs entered God's rest, you would have a good pattern of work and rest in your life. Pray for wisdom about how much work you should do, and for guidance on what to say yes and no to.

Thu: Witness in the city — "For the word of God is alive and active. Sharper than any double –edged sword" (v 12).

Sports and hobbies can be fruitful contexts for sharing our lives and our faith, as people relax and open up. Pray for three people you spend regular leisure time with who do not know Christ. Pray for opportunities to show them how "alive and active" God's word really is.

Fri: Leisure in the city — "Nothing in all creation is hidden from God's sight" (v13).

All our hobbies and leisure time are under God's authority. We can't compartmentalize our spare time as something belonging to ourselves— it too is God's. Pray that you, and every Christian, would use all your time in a way that honors him.
