"²⁵ On one occasion an expert in the law stood up to test Jesus. "Teacher," he asked, "what must I do to inherit eternal life?" ²⁶ "What is written in the Law?" he replied. "How do you read it?"²⁷ He answered, "'Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind'; and, 'Love your neighbor as yourself." v25-27

They stripped him of his clothes, beat him and went away, leaving him half dead." v28-30

³¹ A priest happened to be going down the same road, and when he saw the man, he passed by on the other side. ³² So too, a Levite, when he came to the place and saw him, passed by on the other side." V31-32

- 1- ASK: "God, will you help me to see people the way you do and help me to see beyond my own comfort & conveniences.
- 2- ACT: "God, give me the courage to ACT. God, help me to cross the street, help me to cross the line, cross the aisle, help me to get out of my excuses and be the exception. Help me to BE THE ONE.
