humility and service rather
than superiority?

Pastor Doug discusses the importance of listening in prayer, not just talking. How might incorporating more silence and listening into your prayer life change your relationship with God?

How does understanding giving as a spiritual need, rather than just meeting the church's financial needs, change your perspective on generosity?

How might our understanding of God's love for the world (as in
