EPISODE 8: "I AM HE" PT. 2

Set the Stage: (Watch from 29:00 to the end)

After hearing of Matthew's decision to leave his post as tax collector, Quintus is upset and orders signs to be posted around town issuing a decree as well as declaring Jesus is wanted for questioning.

Jesus and his followers set out to leave town - leaving Nicodemus with a difficult decision...follow Jesus, or keep the life that he and his wife like.

Followed by his disciples, Jesus walks as far as Samaria, where Jesus meets Photina by the well and reveals to her that he is the Messiah. Jesus tells the disciples they will stay in town for the next couple of days.



Session 10 Discussion Questions:


- What are you left thinking about after watching episode 8?
- Do some self reflection, has there ever been a time in your life where you were as excited about Jesus as the woman at the well was? If you have lost excitement, is it possible to bring back some of that excitement?
- How do you think Nicodemus was feeling as Jesus left town? How have you felt similar to this in your life?
- Think about the first people told about Jesus' birth, the first people to discover the empty tomb, and the first he told publicly about His ministry. What was their social status and what can we discern from the purpose Jesus had in all accounts?
- At the end of the episode, Jesus said He did not want food because He was nourished by doing the will of the Father. What does this reveal about the heart Jesus?

Scripture Study: John 4:1-42 (ESV)

Jesus and the Woman at the Well

...**4** And he had to pass through Samaria. **5** So he came to a town of Samaria called Sychar, near the field that Jacob had given to his son Joseph. **6** Jacob's well was there; so Jesus, wearied as he was from his journey, was sitting beside the well. It was about the sixth hour. **7** A woman from Samaria came to draw water. Jesus said to her, "Give me a drink."

...**9** The Samaritan woman said to him, "How is it that you, a Jew, ask for a drink from me, a woman of Samaria?" (For Jews have no dealings with Samaritans.) **10** Jesus answered her, "If you knew the gift of God, and who it is that is saying to you, 'Give me a drink,' you would have asked him, and he would have given you living water."

...**25** The woman said to him, "I know that Messiah is coming (he who is called Christ). When he comes, he will tell us all things." **26** Jesus said to her, "I who speak to you am he."
