#### Matthew 6:9-13 Onscreen

It started with basic bread though. Bread from Heaven Manna.

"Then the LORD said to Moses, "Behold, I will rain bread from heaven for you; and the people shall go out and gather a day's portion every day, that I may test them, whether or not they will walk in My instruction."

## The Four S's

- 1. The need to be SEEN.
- 2. The need to be SOOTHED.
- 3. The need to be SAFE.
- 4. The need to feel SECURE.

#### 1. The Father Sees us

"O LORD, you have searched me and known me. You know when I sit down and when I rise up; You understand my thought from afar. You scrutinize my path and my lying down, And are intimately acquainted with all my ways. Even before there is a word on my tongue, Behold, O LORD, You know it all. You have enclosed me behind and before, And laid Your hand upon me. Such knowledge is too wonderful for me; It is too high, I cannot attain to it." (Psalm 139:1–6, NASB95)

#### 2. The Father Soothes us

"But You, O Lord, are a God merciful and gracious, Slow to anger and abundant in lovingkindness and truth."
(Psalm 86:15, NASB95)

""Indeed, the very hairs of your head are all numbered. Do not fear; you are more valuable than many sparrows." (Luke 12:7, NASB95)

The need to feel SECURE. This means things in life were stable and consistent. We were provided for.

- 8. Our Father in heaven meets each of these. Go back through each one and share how you have experienced each one from the Lord?
