2. What are the most popular desires of someone in America today.

3. Read Matthew 13 and the Parable of the Sower or soils Talk about the 4 soils. Talk about how the Word is lost, stolen, or fruitless? Has this ever happened to you?

4. Stewarding our desires takes courage, tenacity, and will. As Pastor describe the people in Nehemiah doing this, what were your thoughts about your own desires?

- 5. Read Nehemiah Chapter 9.1-3. What do you observe?
- 6. Why did they stand and listen to the reading of the Law? What was the results of this?

7. Pastor said their desires changed because of 5 things. Review and talk about each one.

- 1. There was a leader that was a catalyst. Ezra 9:4-5
- 2. They were exposed to the Word of God

  -Restoring their commitment

## About Nehemiah

Chapter 9.1-3 (NASB) onscreen

We need to steward our desires.

Jesus told a parable about this Matthew 13:18–23 By the road- Devil steals the Word (doesn't understand) Rocky soil- Joy, but no roots, and when hard times come because of their faith they forsake the Word Thorny soil- Sorry of the world, deceitfulness of riches, choke it and no fruit Good Soil-Bring forth fruit – 100-60-30 fold

If we do not control/manage/direct our desires we will fall deeply away from the Lord.

If you do nothing to guide your desires to the Lord, you will have nothing when it comes to spiritual fruit.

James 1:14–15 (ESV) — 14 but each person is tempted when he is lured and enticed by his own desire. 15 Then desire when it has conceived gives birth to sin, and sin when it is fully grown brings forth death. How did Israel, turn their desires to the Lord for a spiritual awakening/revival?
