4 steps the Gospel calls us to:

Allow the Word to **CULTIVATE** our hearts so we can learn to **TRUST** Jesus in all situations and **JOIN** Him in the supernatural life by **LIVING** dependent on His grace not our own works.

The attention and care of our heart condition is the most important spiritual practice we can commit to.

WE NAVIGATE LIFE UNAWARE OF THE EFFECTS ON OUR HEART - Desire over Discernment - What I want over what is best

CULTIVATE: to prepare, to foster

If we are honest with ourselves, our expectation is greater than our preparation. We want the promises of God without living the principles of God

Examples of the heart:

1) Foot path – Hardened Heart

Hardened by sin - Our offence - Someone else's offence (We see God responsible for their offence)

We lay the behavior of man over the character of God this leads us to a distorted conclusion of Gods heart

2. ROCKY PATH – Shallow heart

Emotion of the moment Vs. Rule of life Good intentions VS. Life change

POWERFUL UNDERSTANDING:

Purpose of the Word of God is not to save us from trials but to prepare us for trials We have to remember Gods goodness is not defined by our perception of his faithfulness

3. THORNS – Divided Heart

Worries of life: Worries = Divided mind/drawn into different direction

We decide to manage our own lives through worldly resources Instead of releasing our lives to the supernatural wisdom of heaven

Lures of wealth:

Money & Stuff Position & Achievement

The gospel of western culture: Indulgence leads to freedom The gospel of Christ says: restraint leads to freedom

4. GOOD SOIL – cultivated Heart Takes the word in Immediately, Deeply, Exclusively

Q. HOW DO WE GET GOOD SOIL?

1. "Set our hearts" Colossians 3:1 Since, then, you have been raised with Christ,^(A) set your hearts on things above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God

2. "Guard Your Heart"

Proverbs 4:23 Guard your heart above all else, for it determines the course of your life.
