Three Approaches of the Supernatural

1. I only accept a faith that is logical, intellectual, and void of anything I don't completely understand.
2. I love the supernatural and am open for anything of the Holy Spirit, I'll check the Bible later maybe.

3. A beautiful blend of faith, the Word, embracing the supernatural works of God, the power of the Holy Spirit as outlined in the Scriptures.

We must start with the first jump into the supernatural. All Faith in Christ Starts with Jesus
Faith in Jesus

His life, His Deity, His Ministry, His Teaching, His Lordship, His Death, Burial, and Resurrection.

Faith is the supernatural

John 20.29

Jesus said to him, “Because you have seen Me, have you *now* believed? Blessed are they who did not see, and yet believed.”

We are saved by faith, you are here by faith, I was called to ministry by faith, I pray by faith, worship by faith, adopted into God’s family by faith, forgiven by faith in Christ. Facts about Faith

1. Faith is a choice

We cooperate with our own conscience decision, and the supernatural gift of faith

2. Faith in Christ justifies us.

“Therefore, having been justified by faith, ^[a]we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, ²through whom we also have obtained our introduction by faith into this grace in which we stand; and ^[b]we celebrate in hope of the glory of God.” Romans 5.1-2

3. Faith can grow

“So faith comes by hearing and hearing by the word of Christ” Romans 10.17

4. Faith must be exercised

Romans 5.7 “We walk by faith and not by sight”

5. Faith can be imparted

Through prayer, Through Encouragement, Through Intercession

6. Leader are to be full of faith

Conclusion:

“Therefore as you have received Christ Jesus the Lord, so walk in Him, having been firmly rooted and now being built up in Him and established in your faith, just as you were instructed and overflowing with gratitude.”
