Sermon Discussion Questions: Moral of the Story | Lamp on the Stand Josh Campbell, Compelled Church August 7-8, 2021

- 1. Are you familiar with the Parable "The Lamp on the Lamp Stand?
 - a. Matthew 5:14-16
 - ii. "You are the light of the world. A city set on a hill cannot be hidden; nor do people light a lamp and put it under a basket, but on the lampstand, and it gives light to all who are in the house. Your light must shine before people in such a way that they may see your good works and glorify your Father who is in heaven."
 - b. In your own words what is Matthew 5:14-16 teaching us?
- 2. Why don't we put our light on the lampstand?
- 3. Have you ever felt like God has failed you?
 - a. If you have ever felt like this, read the story of Joseph and how he overcame difficult circumstances repeatedly (Gen. 37-41).
 - i. Joseph learned to trust God even when it didn't make sense.
 - ii. What do you need to turn over to God and trust Him?
- 4. As we reflect on Josh's story (his traumatic experience), has God ever spoke to you?
 - a. Most of us don't hear God audibly, but has His still small voice given you a thought, a prompting, or a feeling? Share your experience.
 - b. Has God ever put you in (allowed) what seems like an impossible situation, and brought you through it? Share your experience.
- 5. Who are you? Who does God say you are? How does trust fit into who God says you are?
- 6. What does it look like to be the light?
 - a. Look at Ephesians 5:8-9
 - i. For you were once darkness, but now you are light in the Lord; walk as children of light (for the fruit of the light consists in all goodness, righteousness, and truth), as you try to learn what is pleasing to the Lord.
 - b. How does Ephesians 5: 8-9 help us understand what being a light looks like?
- 7. Josh shared how he has been saved for 5 years, has served in kids and students ministries for 4 years and because of those experiences God has challenged him to step out of his comfort zone to pray, lead and just let his light shine.
 - a. What is God pushing you to do? How or in what way is God pressing on your heart to step out in faith and be a light?
