O Night Devine: A New and Glorious Morn

Matthew 1.18-25

Over 300 Old Testament prophecies came to life at the birth of Christ.

Some of the most Common:

The Virgin Birth: Jesus would be born of a virgin (Isaiah 7:14, fulfilled in Matthew 1:22-23 and Luke 1:26-38).

•**The Place of Birth:** He would be born in Bethlehem (Micah 5:2, fulfilled in Matthew 2:1 and Luke 2:4-6).

The Lineage: He would be a descendant of Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, and King David (e.g., Genesis 12:3; 2 Samuel 7:12-13; Isaiah 11:1, fulfilled in the genealogies in Matthew 1 and Luke 3).

The Escape to Egypt: Being called out of Egypt (Hosea 11:1, fulfilled in Matthew 2:14-15).

The Massacre of Children: The lamentation after the children of Bethlehem were killed by Herod (Jeremiah 31:15, fulfilled in Matthew 2:16-18).

Worship and Gifts: Kings (Magi) would worship him and present gifts (Psalm 72:10, fulfilled in Matthew 2:11).

The Bible says that His followers could expect:

- Persecution and Hatred from the World (John 15.18)
- Trouble and trials (John 6.33).
- Self-Denial and Sacrifice (Luke 9.23)
- Loss and Rejection (Mark 10.29)
- Gift of the Holy Spirit, The Peace in the midst of Trouble, Abundant Life, the Joy of Jesus, His presence and guidance, Eternal Life, a new Spirit and a New family.

1. Christ is a Deliverer

He came to the world to deliver us from sin.

2. God is Faithful
