1. Embrace the mysteries of God by faith

- The Mysteries of healing
- The Mystery of the Trinity
- The Mystery of Water Baptism

2. Live in the mysteries with joy

- Instead of it bringing angst or unbelief, move to joy? Why?
- God is so much greater than us.

- He is in charge (we can rest in his Lordship).

3. Respond to the mysteries with wonder and Awe
