1. What are some key things the Lord has shown you during the “Apostles Creed” Series?
2. As Pastor Nate shared his own journey with grief and Heaven becoming more of an interest and reality, can you relate to him? How?
3. The following verses are promises we have on living in eternal life as we live for Christ.
 - “The world and its desires pass away, but whoever does the will of God lives forever.” **1 John 2.7**
 - “Whoever believes in the Son has eternal life, but whoever rejects the Son will not see life, for God’s wrath remains on them.” **John 3.36**
 - “The world and its desires pass away, but whoever does the will of God lives forever.” **1 John 2.17**
 - “For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish, but have eternal life. **John 3.16**

How do these bless you?

4. Read 1 Corinthians 15.50-58
 - How would you define the word “imperishable” as the NASB translates
 - What is imperishable?
 - Who loses because of the resurrection (vv. 54-55).
 - According to verse 57, Who gives us the victory and what is that victory?
5. Because of the amazing things taught in 1 Corinthians chapter 15, and the last verses, how does verse 58 say we should live?
6. What is our “toil” or work not in vain, or for nothing?
7. Pastor said eternal life starts when your faith in Christ starts? Have you heard this before? We live with Christ now, not someday in Heaven. What are the daily implications and realities of this?
8. God wants to speak to us, to draw us closer, to reveal Himself, to transform us to be more like Him. How does or is this happening in your life? Can you share a time when God revealed himself, and you grew in Christ in the midst of a hard time in life, a failure, or a new season?

9. Read John 7.37-39

³⁷Now on the last day, the great day of the feast, Jesus stood and cried out, saying, “If anyone is thirsty, let him come to Me and drink.

³⁸“He who believes in Me, as the Scripture said, ‘From his innermost being will flow rivers of living water.’ ”

³⁹But this He spoke of the Spirit, whom those who believed in Him were to receive; for the Spirit was not yet given, because Jesus was not yet glorified.

Close in prayer about thirsting for God, drinking Christ and being sustained, and being filled with His Spirit.
