Matthew 6.9-13

"Jesus was going throughout all Galilee, teaching in their synagogues and proclaiming the gospel of the kingdom, and healing every kind of disease and every kind of sickness among the people." (Matthew 4:23, NASB95)

And we are to pray that it is to come on earth as it is in Heaven

- 1) Present, in our hearts
- 2) Eschatological, visible

1. Jesus talked a lot about the Kingdom of God.

Jesus answered, "My kingdom is not of this world. If my kingdom were of this world, my servants would have been fighting, that I might not be delivered over to the Jews. But my kingdom is not from the world." (John 18:36)

Being asked by the Pharisees when the kingdom of God would come, he answered them, "The kingdom of God is not coming with signs to be observed, nor will they say, 'Look, here it is!' or 'There!' for behold, the kingdom of God is in the midst of you." (Luke 17:20-21)

Now after John was arrested, Jesus came into Galilee, proclaiming the gospel of God, and saying, "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand; repent and believe in the gospel." (Mark 1:14-15)

2. What is the Kingdom of God

- The KOG is not a physical place.
- The KOG was established on earth when Jesus Christ came into the world, gave his life, rose from the dead.
- We are to receive the KOG by faith.
- The Kingdom of God is the defeat and sins reign on humanity, and the defeat of evil in hearts, if we choose to be part.
- Jesus is the King

3. The Kingdom of God is first in our hearts- Ezekiel 36.26

4. We live the Kingdom of God, on earth as it is in Heaven

Letting Jesus change our hearts, thus our lives – 2 Corinthians 5.17-19 Starts at Salvation, continues till physical death
