1. Did you know about the 5 judgments Pastor taught this weekend?

2. Judgement #1 Jesus was judged for the sin of the world

Read 1 Peter 2:21–25 . What does these verses teach us? How can we apply them daily to our lives?

3. Read Romans 8.1 “Therefore there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus. For the law of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus has set you free from the law of sin and of death. “

Why is this so awesome?

4. Read Acts 17.30-31

Pastor said The Great White Throne Judgment is The judgment of the wicked, those that have rejected the salvation of God, the testimony of Christ, and God himself.

5. Read Romans 2.5. What is Paul saying here about the Great White Throne Judgment?

6 Review the 4 things that impact us and discuss which ones you have not considered much before.

Four things impacts of this final Judgment?

- The final judgment should help us forgive others freely -God’s justice should prevent us from seeking revenge, or hating.
- The final judgment satisfies our sense for justice in this world.
- The final judgment should motivate us to live righteous. Wicked and evil living will be judged. Our faith must be active.
- The final judgment should motivate the missional Church-We need to keep evangelizing and helping people get saved.

7. The last judgment is the Bema Seat or Judgment seat of Christ

2 Corinthians 5:6–10 (NASB95)

“Therefore, being always of good courage, and knowing that while we are at home in the body we are absent from the Lord— for we walk by faith, not by sight— we are of good courage, I say, and prefer rather to be absent from the body and to be at home with the Lord. Therefore we also have as our ambition, whether at home or absent, to be pleasing to Him. For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, so that each one may be recompensed for his deeds in the body, according to what he has done, whether good or bad.
