- A world filled with loss, a sense of despondency and abandonment
 - Loss of love
 - Loss of hope
 - Injustice



a Window to God's Reign What does it show of the Kingdom?

- Two crowds awareness of death,
 awareness of life in Jesus
- The bridge between heaven and earth:
 Jesus' compassion
- 2nd resurrection: Elisha (2 Kings 4:9-10)
 - No need to go call the prophet
 - No fear of becoming "unclean"
- The disciples followed Jesus



a Door into God's Kingdom What is the invitation in Text?

- Life: "Be moved by His compassion"
