# Accelerated success: Temptations of Leadership Lee-Ann van Rensburg 19/08/2018

I Cor. 10:12 "So, if you think you are standing firm, be careful that you don't fall!"

Nehemiah 5: 14-19 "For the entire twelve years that I was governor of Judah—from the twentieth year to the thirty-second year of the reign of King Artaxerxe—neither I nor my officials drew on our official food allowance. The former governors, in contrast, had laid heavy burdens on the people, demanding a daily ration of food and wine, besides forty piece of silver. Even their assistants took advantage of the people. But because I feared God, I did not act that way. I also devoted myself to working on the wall and refused to acquire any land. And I required all my servants to spend time working on the wall. I asked for nothing, even though I regularly fed 150 Jewish officials at my table, besides all the visitors from other lands! 18The provisions I paid for each day included one ox, six choice sheep or goats, and a large number of poultry. And every ten days we needed a large supply of all kinds of wine. Yet I refused to claim the governor's food allowance because the people already carried a heavy burden. Remember, O my God, all that I have done for these people, and bless me for it."

#### 1. THREE TEMPTATIONS OF LEADERSHIP

- **1.1.** You will be tempted to misuse your position.
- **1.2.** You will be tempted to abuse your power.
- **1.3.** You will be tempted to profit from your privileges.

### 2. HOW TO KEEP YOUR INTEGRITY AS A LEADER

- **2.1.** Deepen you reverence for God:
  - You have to realize the magnitude of God and His role in your life. He is both loving father and king!

Psalm 75:6 "For promotion and power come from nowhere on earth, but only from God. He promotes one and deposes another"

Realize that God is holding you accountable.

- **2.2.** Develop deeper love for people. Focus on what you can give, not on what you can receive.
- **2.3.** Discipline yourself and keep your eye on the eternal reward in heaven.
  - Disciplining yourself means limiting your own freedom.
  - Leaders focus on their responsibilities, not their rights.

Heb. 6:10 "God will not forget your work and the love you have shown him as you have helped his people and continue to help them."

Matthew 6:19-21 (AMPC) "Do not [a]gather and heap up and store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust and worm consume and destroy, and where thieves break through and steal. But [b]gather and heap up and store for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust nor worm consume and destroy, and where thieves do not break through and steal; For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also."

Heb. 13:7 (NIV) "Submit to their authority [that of the spiritual leaders]. They keep watch over you as men who must give an account. Obey them so that their work will be a joy, not a burden, for that would be no advantage to you."
