

5-Day Bible Reading Plan: We Are Destiny Pt 4

Day 1: Discovering Your Identity in Christ

Reading: Ephesians 2:19-22

Devotional

Before God calls you to do anything, He establishes who you are in Him. You are not a stranger or outsider—you are a member of God's household, built on the foundation of Christ Himself. Just as a building requires a cornerstone to determine its alignment, Jesus is the cornerstone that defines your identity. Everything in your life must align with Him first. Today, pause and reflect: Are you building your life on performance or on your identity as God's beloved child? Remember, sonship precedes service. Belonging comes before behaving. Let Jesus be the foundation that anchors every decision, every relationship, and every step forward. When your identity is secure in Him, everything else finds its proper place.

Day 2: Growing Deep Before Going Tall

Reading: Colossians 2:6-7

Devotional

The Japanese bamboo tree spends years developing an extensive root system before breaking through the soil. Similarly, God grows you deep before He grows you tall. Salvation is instantaneous, but spiritual maturity is a process. Paul reminds us to be "rooted and built up in Him, strengthened in the faith." Hidden growth is not inactive growth—God is working beneath the surface, establishing strength in your character, integrity, and faith. Don't despise the seasons when nothing seems visible. God is anchoring you for what's ahead. The depth of your roots determines the height of your reach. Invest in prayer, immerse yourself

in Scripture, and commit to spiritual disciplines. What God develops in private, He will reveal in public. Trust the process.

Day 3: Deployed for Kingdom Purpose

Reading: Acts 13:36

Devotional

David "served the purpose of God in his generation" and then rested. This is your calling too—to serve God's purpose in your generation. You were not saved to sit comfortably; you were saved to be sent purposefully. Deployment requires clarity about your calling, maturity in your character, and willingness to step into the assignment. God has strategically placed you in your family, workplace, neighborhood, and community for kingdom impact. You are not here by accident. Ask yourself today: Am I spectating or participating? Am I consuming or contributing? The church is not a cruise ship for comfort but a battleship for mission. Step into your assignment with confidence, knowing that God equips those He calls. Your generation is waiting for you to rise.

Day 4: Building a Legacy That Lasts

Reading: Matthew 7:24-27

Devotional

Jesus contrasts two builders—one who built on rock and one who built on sand. Both faced storms, but only one structure survived. The difference wasn't the storm's intensity but the foundation's strength. When you build your life, marriage, family, and future on Jesus, you create a legacy that endures beyond your lifetime. A strong foundation produces families that last, faith that endures, and children who walk in truth long after you're gone. God is not building a moment in your life; He's building a legacy. The enemy attacks your foundation because he

fears generational impact. Strengthen your spiritual disciplines. Prioritize prayer, worship, and God's Word. What you establish today will determine what your children inherit tomorrow. Build wisely. Build deeply. Build on Christ.

Day 5: Aligned and Ready for Increase

Reading: Psalm 127:1; Ephesians 4:15-16

Devotional

"Unless the Lord builds the house, the builders labor in vain." Alignment with God's purposes positions you to carry what He's releasing. When the body of Christ is joined and fitted together, every part working properly, growth happens naturally. God doesn't send increase where there's no structure to hold it. He doesn't pour blessing into broken systems or divided houses. This season requires stronger unity, deeper commitment, and intentional alignment. Are you connected to a local church? Are you serving, giving, and growing? God is preparing to do more, but He needs a people ready to carry more. Alignment isn't optional—it's essential. When you align your life with God's Word, His Spirit, and His people, you position yourself for a breakthrough. Get planted. Get serving. Get ready. The harvest is coming, and the house must be prepared.

As you complete this reading plan, remember: We are building for generations. We are building for legacy. We are building on Christ, the solid Rock. When the foundation is Jesus, the structure will stand, the vision will live, and the glory of the Lord will fill the house.
