



Give God Seven – Day 5

Theme: Faith to Take Action Immediately

Today's focus is on the kind of faith that does not just believe but moves. Faith is never passive; it shows itself in obedience and courage. Abraham's story reminds us that when God speaks, faith responds without delay.

Scripture to Meditate

Genesis 22:3 (CSB)

So Abraham got up early in the morning, saddled his donkey, and took with him two of his young men and his son Isaac. He split the wood for a burnt offering and set out to go to the place God had told him about.

Reflect

Abraham did not hesitate; he rose early and acted on what God said, even when it meant sacrifice. True faith always requires trust that God will provide, even when we do not yet see how. The test of faith is not only in hearing God's voice but in the willingness to move when He calls.

Ask yourself: What step of faith is God asking me to take that requires immediate action?

Practice (7 minutes or more)

- Word: Read Genesis 22:1–14. Notice Abraham's readiness to obey and God's faithfulness to provide.
- Prayer: Ask God for courage to act on His word, especially in the areas that feel costly.
- Worship: Lift a song that declares trust in God's promises and His provision.
- Faith in Action: Take a leap today toward obedience in something you have delayed. Do not wait for conditions to feel perfect; trust God and move.

Final Thought

Faith without action is empty. Every step of obedience positions you to see the faithfulness of God. Like Abraham, rise early, move quickly, and trust that the God who calls you to act will also provide.
