I. Jacob, who had a deceptive mom.

A. The art of deception that he learned from his mom.

And Jacob said to Rebekah his mother, Behold, Esau my brother is a hairy man, and I am a smooth man: (V. 12) My father peradventure will feel me, and I shall seem to him as a deceiver; and I shall bring a curse upon me, and not a blessing. (V. 13) And his mother said unto him, Upon me be thy curse, my son: only obey my voice, and go fetch me them.

Genesis 27:11-13

B. The activity of deception he lived in his life.

And Jacob sod pottage: and Esau came from the field, and he was faint: (V. 30) And Esau said to Jacob, Feed me, I pray thee, with that same red pottage; for I am faint: therefore was his name called Edom. (V. 31) And Jacob said, Sell me this day thy birthright. (V. 32) And Esau said, Behold, I am at the point to die: and what profit shall this birthright do to me? (V.33) And Jacob said, Swear to me this day; and he sware unto him: and he sold his birthright unto Jacob. Genesis 25:29-32

Famous Root of Bitterness: *Lest there be any fornicator, or profane person, as Esau, who for one morsel of meat sold his birthright. (V. 17) For ye know how that afterward, when he would have inherited the blessing, he was rejected: for he found no place of repentance, though he sought it carefully with tears. Hebrews 12:16-17*

II. Moses, who had a delivering mom.
