Jesus, A Chosen Vessel of Grace

(Text) Philippians 2:5 Let this mind be in you, which was also in Christ Jesus: (V.6) Who, being in the form of God, thought it not robbery to be equal with God:

I. Jesus became a vessel that resembled any other vessel.

Philippians 2:7 But made himself of no reputation, and took upon him the form of a servant, and was made in the likeness of men.

Isaiah 53:3 He is despised and rejected of men; a man of sorrows, and acquainted with grief: and we hid as it were our faces from him; he was despised, and we esteemed him not.

II. Jesus became a vessel that redeemed all other vessels.

Philippians 2:8 And being found in fashion as a man, he humbled himself, and became obedient unto death, even the death of the cross.

Isaiah 53:4 Surely he hath borne our griefs, and carried our sorrows: yet we did esteem him stricken, smitten of God, and afflicted. (V.5) But he was wounded for our transgressions, he was bruised for our iniquities: the chastisement of our peace was upon him; and with his stripes we are healed.
