## Psalm 15 "Who Shall Dwell with God?"

Main Point: Our commitment to truth and how we treat others directly impacts our closeness with God.

## I. Heartfelt obedience and commitment to truth draws us close to God (vv. 1–2).

Romans 4:23–25; 2 Corinthians 5:17–21; Romans 8:13, "<sup>13</sup> For if you live according to the flesh you will die, but if by the Spirit you put to death the deeds of the body, you will live."

## II. Gossip, discord, being critical of others distances us from God (v. 3).

Proverbs 22:1, "A good name is to be chosen rather than great riches, and favor is better than silver or gold." Titus 3:10, "<sup>10</sup> As for a person who stirs up division, after warning him once and then twice, have nothing more to do with him, <sup>11</sup> knowing that such a person is warped and sinful; he is self-condemned." Galatians 6:1–2, "Brothers, if anyone is caught in any transgression, you who are spiritual should restore him in a spirit of gentleness. Keep watch on yourself, lest you too be tempted. <sup>2</sup> Bear one another's burdens, and so fulfill the law of Christ."

## III. God blesses sacrificial love with stability (vv. 4–5).

Proverbs 17:15, "<sup>15</sup> He who justifies the wicked and he who condemns the righteous are both alike an abomination to the Lord." Micah 6:8, "<sup>8</sup> He has told you, O man, what is good; and what does the Lord require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?"
