

Psalm 9 “Recounting God’s Wonder”

Main Point: Philippians 4:4, “Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, rejoice.”

I. Praise God for what He has done (vv. 1–6).

Philippians 4:6–7, “⁶ do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. ⁷ And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.” Psalm 1:6, “for the Lord knows the way of the righteous, but the way of the wicked will perish.” Psalm 2:12, “Kiss the Son, lest he be angry, and you perish in the way, for his wrath is quickly kindled. Blessed are all who take refuge in him.” Psalm 2:4–6; Genesis 3:15, “¹⁵ I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and her offspring; he shall bruise your head, and you shall bruise his heel.”

II. Praise God for His protection (vv. 7–14).

John 1:12–13, “¹² But to all who did receive him, who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God, ¹³ who were born, not of blood nor of the will of the flesh nor of the will of man, but of God.” Hebrews 12:2, “² looking to Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God.”

III. Pray for God’s deliverance (vv. 15–20).

Malachi 3:17–18, “¹⁷ “They shall be mine, says the Lord of hosts, in the day when I make up my treasured possession, and I will spare them as a man spares his son who serves him. ¹⁸ Then once more you shall see the distinction between the righteous and the wicked, between one who serves God and one who does not serve him.”
