

Acts 24:1–27 “Deadly Distractions”

Main Point: *Flattery, dishonesty, and procrastination lead to devastation, but repentance leads to restoration.*

I. Beware of Dishonest Flattery (vv. 1–9).

Proverbs 19:10, “*It is not fitting for a fool to live in luxury, much less for a slave to rule over princes.*” Romans 7:18, “¹⁸*For I know that nothing good dwells in me, that is, in my flesh. For I have the desire to do what is right, but not the ability to carry it out.*” Romans 3:12, “*All have turned aside; together they have become worthless; no one does good, not even one.*”

II. Be Aware of our resurrection hope (vv. 10–21).

John 14:6, “⁶*Jesus said to him, “I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me.”*

III. Don’t Procrastinate (vv. 22–27).

Colossians 4:5, “⁵*Walk in wisdom toward outsiders, making the best use of the time.*” Ephesians 5:15–16, “¹⁵*Look carefully then how you walk, not as unwise but as wise, ¹⁶making the best use of the time, because the days are evil.*” 1 Timothy 6:6, “⁶*But godliness with contentment is great gain.*” Romans 1:28, “²⁸*And since they did not see fit to acknowledge God, God gave them up to a debased mind to do what ought not to be done.*”

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
