- LIVE A LIFE OF GRATITUDE


When you begin to live a lifestyle of worship then ...

# **DISCUSSION QUESTIONS:**

#### Before diving into scripture, answer this question:

 If God puts His ear to your chest, will He hear the heartbeat of Jesus?



#### READ John 20:21 & Luke 19:10

- What evidence does your life give that you have the same "heartbeat" as Jesus?
- Why must this be true of us if we are genuinely following Him?

#### **READ Romans 12:1**

- What does Paul mean by "Offer your bodies as a living sacrifice? (See also Rom 6:13-16, 1 Pet 1:14, 1Jn 2:15)
- Name a few areas of sacrifice that you have given to God and how has that impacted your relationship with Jesus?



#### **READ Colossians 3:15-17**

- After reading these verses,
  - What immediately stands out to you?
  - Does anything in this passage particularly confuse you, encourage you or convict you?
  - How have you experienced the peace that Christ can bring in your own life?
  - Do you have any specific examples of a time or situation where you felt that worshiping God brought you peace at a time you would otherwise have been anxious or fearful or fighting?

- ASK the Holy Spirit to help you make a list of the things your heart "beats for." Be honest with yourself, recognizing that change can only come through honest assessment.
