

## READ Daniel 4:29–34

- How does Nebuchadnezzar describe his achievements and accomplishments in these verses?
- How does God respond to Nebuchadnezzar's pride?
- What does the process of Nebuchadnezzar's humbling involve according to this passage?
  - In what ways does God's humbling of Nebuchadnezzar contrast with his previous attitude of pride?
- What can we learn about the dangers of pride from Nebuchadnezzar's experience?
- How does Nebuchadnezzar's transformation illustrate the biblical principle found in James 4:6?
- How can we guard against falling into the trap of pride in our own lives?
  - What steps can we take to cultivate humility and acknowledge God's role in our achievements?
- Share a personal experience or story where you've witnessed the destructive effects of pride or the transformative power of humility.

# LIVING IT OUT SECTION

- **This week**, take a journey of self-reflection and transformation by focusing on pride and humility. Ask the Holy Spirit to identify areas of pride in your life and actively cultivate a spirit of humility.
  - Read and meditate on Daniel 4:29–34.
  - Set aside time for honest self-examination. Journal about instances where you've exhibited pride or taken credit for your achievements without acknowledging God's role.
  - Ask the Holy Spirit to help reveal areas of pride in your heart and to help you surrender them. Express your willingness to humble yourself before Him.
