



DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

READ Romans 16:3-5

- Reflect on the diverse individuals mentioned in these verses. How does their inclusion in the passage highlight the beauty of diversity within the church family?
 - Share examples of diverse gifts and roles you have observed within our own church community.

READ Romans 16:6-7

- Discuss the barriers that can exist within the church family due to cultural, social, or personal differences.
- How have you seen these barriers affect unity within our church community?
- How can we overcome them through Christ's love?



READ Romans 16:12

- Reflect on the importance of intergenerational relationships within the church family.
 - How can older and younger believers learn from one another and grow together in their faith?
- Discuss the wisdom and insights gained from connecting across different age groups.
 - How can we intentionally foster these connections within our church family?
 - What steps can we take to bridge the generational gaps and build stronger relationships?
