2. Bring your faith home by removing influences driven by greed.

a. Deuteronomy 7:1-5

- i. Challenging chapter "one of the most problematic, if not offensive, texts in all Scripture"
 - 1. Rhetorical strengthening of Exodus 23 40 year recap
 - 2. Emphasis is on God's deliverance/judgment Israel is agent
 - 3. Only 4 accounts of total destruction Jericho, etc.
 - 4. The point is the blessing and well-being of the people via obedience (11-15).
 - a. Verse 11 is the center of the structure
 - 5. Connection to us
 - a. God prepared a home for Israel to be free from the harmful influences of the world.
 - b. God wants your home to be free from the harmful influences of the world.
 - c. He has driven out the hold of sin.
 - i. **Colossians 1:13-14.** For he has rescued us from the dominion of darkness and brought us into the kingdom of the Son he loves, in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins.
 - d. We are to remove the influence of the world.

- i. **Ephesians 6:11-12.** Put on the full armor of God, so that you can take your stand against the devil's schemes. For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms.
- b. People treaties and intermarriage, covenant relationships with people who don't share your faith
 - i. **2 Corinthians 6:14.** Do not be yoked together with unbelievers. For what do righteousness and wickedness have in common? Or what fellowship can light have with darkness?
 - ii. They will pull you away from your faith (4).
 - iii. They will ensnare you through pity (16).
 - iv. They will ensnare you through fear (18, 21).

3. Bring your faith home by removing influences driven by gold.

a. Deuteronomy 7:25-26

- b. Things idols, things that draw us away from our faith by dominating our time and attention ensnare us through covetousness
- 4. Premarital counseling couple he lost a scholarship, she mostly lost her faith.

5. Bring your faith home by repeating influences driven by grace.

a. Deuteronomy 7:6-9

- b. God conquers his enemies by his grace i. Saul
- c. Three aspects of God's grace:
 - i. Unconditional affection (7-8)
 - ii. Dispels fear (17-20)
 - iii. Increases blessings over time (21-22)
