Interesting Facts about the Parables of Jesus...

- Parables make up one-third of what Jesus says
- All of Jesus' parables are found in Matthew, Mark, and Luke
- Mark contains the fewest; Luke the greatest
- There are 30-40 parables attributed to Jesus
- There are parables in the Old Testament

Why Did Jesus Use Parables?

- They were an essential part of His life
- Jesus wanted to introduce His hearers to the way He sees the world
- They impressed people the way they heard
- They are a feature of Jesus as a Teacher
- They stick with you they are easy to remember

- Teaching Mark 4:1-2
- Fulfill prophecy Mark 4:12; Isaiah 6:9-10
- Clarification Mark 4:33-34

- Highlights the behavior of those who are indeed God's people
- Describes the activity and/or destiny of the unrighteous

Parables describe the activity of God in Jesus, more particularly so that men [people] may trust in it [the activity of God] and become disciples, or else be offended at it."
