Advent Conspiracy: Spend Less Pastor Taylor Terzek 12.6.2020

- [1] I said to myself, "Go ahead, I will test you with pleasure; enjoy what is good." But it turned out to be futile. [2] I said about laughter, "It is madness," and about pleasure, "What does this accomplish?" [3] I explored with my mind the pull of wine on my body --my mind still guiding me with wisdom -- and how to grasp folly, until I could see what is good for people to do under heaven during the few days of their lives. [Ecc 2:1-3 CSB]
- [4] I increased my achievements. I built houses and planted vineyards for myself. [5] I made gardens and parks for myself and planted every kind of fruit tree in them. [6] I constructed reservoirs for myself from which to irrigate a grove of flourishing trees. [7] I acquired male and female servants and had slaves who were born in my house. I also owned livestock -- large herds and flocks -- more than all who were before me in Jerusalem. [Ecc 2:4-7 CSB]
- [8] I also amassed silver and gold for myself, and the treasure of kings and provinces. I gathered male and female singers for myself, and many concubines, the delights of men. [9] So I became great and surpassed all who were before me in Jerusalem; my wisdom also remained with me. [10] All that my eyes desired, I did not deny them. I did not refuse myself any pleasure, for I took pleasure in all my struggles. This was my reward for all my struggles... [Ecc 2:8-10 CSB]
- [11] When I considered all that I had accomplished and what I had labored to achieve, I found everything to be futile and a pursuit of the wind. There was nothing to be gained under the sun. [Ecc 2:11 CSB]

- The average American home contains about 300,000 items.
- The average American home contains more televisions than people.
- 25 percent of people with two-car garages don't have room to park cars inside.
- Home organization is a \$8 billion industry, growing at 10 percent each year.
- One out of every ten American households rent offsite storage.
- Off-site storage is the fastest-growing segment of the commercial real-estate industry over the past four decades.
