Update from the Finance Committee : $\mathbf{3}^{\text{rd}}$ Quarter of 2023 :

In terms of the Operating Fund, the church income includes that received in general offerings and other income sources such as building rental and fundraising activities. Church expenses include salaries, insurance, utilities, maintenance, conference obligations and other costs to keep the church operating.

ERC Refund: In the 3rd quarter we also received a large refund from the Employee Retention Credits (ERC) program, a federal program for pandemic relief. This was a one-time refund, that amounted to \$24,468 of income, net of some accounting fees. Without this refund the 3rd quarter numbers shown below would have been much different: -\$14,175 net income for the 3rd quarter and -\$9,880 net income for the year to date, with an operating fund balance of \$8,477 at the end of the 3rd quarter, down \$10,758 for the year, instead of up \$13,710 for the year.
