DAY 1: JESUS, OUR CHAMPION

READING: PSALM 18:1-6, 16-19

Devotional: When life backs you into a corner and battles seem overwhelming, remember you have a Champion. Just as children call upon their strongest protector, we can call upon Jesus—the undefeated One who reigns in dominion, power, and love. The psalmist declares, "The LORD is my rock, my fortress and my deliverer." Your struggles don't define you; your Champion does. Whatever you're facing today—financial pressure, health concerns, relationship struggles—you don't fight alone. Jesus has already conquered every enemy you'll ever face. His name is a strong tower; run to it. Speak His name over your situation: "Jesus, you are my Champion." Let this truth sink deep: the presence of the Lord is with you, and His love is all you need.

Reflection: What battle are you facing that you need to surrender to your Champion today?

How does the concept of living 'my truth' versus 'the truth' manifest in your daily decisions, and where have you seen the consequences of building life on subjective feelings rather than God's Word?

The pastor shared that truth is revealed through relationship with Jesus Christ rather than created by our own thinking. What practices help you distinguish between your own invented truth and God's revealed truth?

Reflecting on the broken mirror illustration, what are the 'cracks' in your life that distort how you see yourself, and how does God's truth offer a clearer reflection of your identity?

DAY 2: TRUTH IS REVEALED, NOT CREATED

READING: JOHN 8:31-36; JOHN 14:6

Devotional: In a culture shouting "live your truth," Jesus whispers a revolutionary message: truth isn't something you create; it's Someone you discover. Jesus declares, "I am the way, the truth, and the life." Many construct their identity on feelings, opinions, and social media affirmations, building lives on sinking sand. But genuine freedom comes only through knowing Christ. When you continue in His Word, you become His true disciple, and then—only then—will you know the truth that sets you free. Your feelings fluctuate; God's truth stands eternal. Your circumstances change; His Word remains constant. Stop inventing narratives about who you are and start discovering who God says you are. The mirror of culture distorts your image, but God's Word reflects your true identity as His beloved creation.

Reflection: Where have you been trusting your feelings over God's truth?

The sermon emphasized that we cannot sustain ourselves apart from our Creator. In what areas of your life are you still trying to maintain control instead of trusting God as the source of all truth and provision?

DAY 3: THE FOUNDATION THAT HOLDS

READING: MATTHEW 7:24-27; PROVERBS 14:12

Devotional: Building your life on subjective truth is like constructing a house without consulting the architect's plans. Proverbs warns, "There is a way that seems right to a man, but it ends in the way of death." Your sincere beliefs, positive thinking, and best intentions cannot substitute for God's objective truth found in Scripture. The manufacturer of a bicycle provides instructions because he created it; God created you and provided His Word as your instruction manual. When storms come—and they will—only those foundations built on Christ's truth will stand. Everything you desire—purpose, peace, provision—is found in alignment with God's will, not your wishes. Seek first His kingdom and righteousness, and He'll add everything else. Don't rush God's timing; His delays are not denials but divine appointments for your good.

Reflection: What area of your life needs realignment with God's Word rather than your preferences?

DAY 4: FAITH WITHOUT WORKS IS DEAD

READING: JAMES 2:14-26; HEBREWS 11:1, 6

Devotional: Belief without action is like owning a car but never turning the key. James challenges us: "Faith without works is dead." You can believe God will provide, heal, or deliver, but faith requires stepping out—sometimes when the path isn't clear. It's not enough to think positively; you must move forward obediently. Abraham believed God's promise, but he had to leave his homeland. The Israelites believed in deliverance, but they had to march toward the Red Sea. What has God called you to do that you've been postponing? Your best life isn't found in comfort zones but in obedient action. God doesn't ask you to see the whole staircase—just take the next step. When you combine belief with obedient action, miracles happen. Stop waiting for perfect conditions and start walking in faith today.

Reflection: What step of obedience is God calling you to take today?

DAY 5: FREEDOM IN SURRENDER

READING: ROMANS 7:21-8:2; 2 CORINTHIANS 3:17

Devotional: True freedom seems paradoxical: it comes through surrender, not control. Paul cried, "Who will deliver me from this body of death?" Then answered with joy: "Thanks be to God through Jesus Christ our Lord!" You cannot fix yourself, heal yourself, or free yourself from bondage. Only Jesus can. The greatest lie is that controlling your own destiny brings freedom; the greatest truth is that surrendering to Christ brings liberty. "Where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom." Stop carrying the weight of living "your truth" and embrace His truth. Confess your struggles, surrender your plans, and watch God transform your life. Like the prisoner who finally confesses and finds peace despite remaining behind bars, you can be free internally regardless of external circumstances. Christ offers abundant life—not just existence, but fullness, purpose, and joy. Will you surrender today?

Reflection: What burden do you need to lay at Jesus' feet to experience true freedom?

The message stated that freedom comes from truth, not feelings. What burden, struggle, or false narrative are you carrying that God is inviting you to exchange for His truth and the freedom it brings?
