Overview

Sermon: *Greater Purpose*. Bottom line: *A greater faith is a greater purpose.*

“Now faith is confidence in what we hope for and assurance about what we do not see. And without faith it is impossible to please God, because anyone who comes to him must believe that he exists and that he rewards those who earnestly seek him.” – Hebrews 11:1,6

Do you ever feel yourself getting stuck in a rut in life? Do you feel complacent or question your beliefs? Luckily you are not alone. The Hebrew church faced the same questions. Read and discuss together this week as you seek a life of purpose and meaning. Listen for what God might be telling you as you seek to have a greater faith.

Discussion

1. Tyler talked about the rise of the “None’s” in America. Why do you think this segment of the population is growing? Do you have any family or friends that might be classified as a “none?”
2. Read Hebrews 2:1-4. The writer of Hebrews is encouraging Christians not to drift away. What might be some things that would cause a Christian to drift away from their faith?
3. Read Hebrews 3:1-6. The people of the Hebrew church were tempted to elevate Moses to the same level as Jesus. Who might we be willing to elevate to a higher level in our lives than we should?
4. Read Hebrews 3:16-19. Think about the miracles the Israelites witnessed. How do you think they could have become complacent? How can you keep your faith from being complacent?

Application

5. If encouragement is the kryptonite for complacency then we need to practice it. Go around the group and encourage each other. Make a list of some people you know that need encouragement. Send those people a text, write them a letter, or give them a call to encourage them.
6. What do you think living the Christian life with purpose looks like? What might be some ways you could live life with more purpose?
