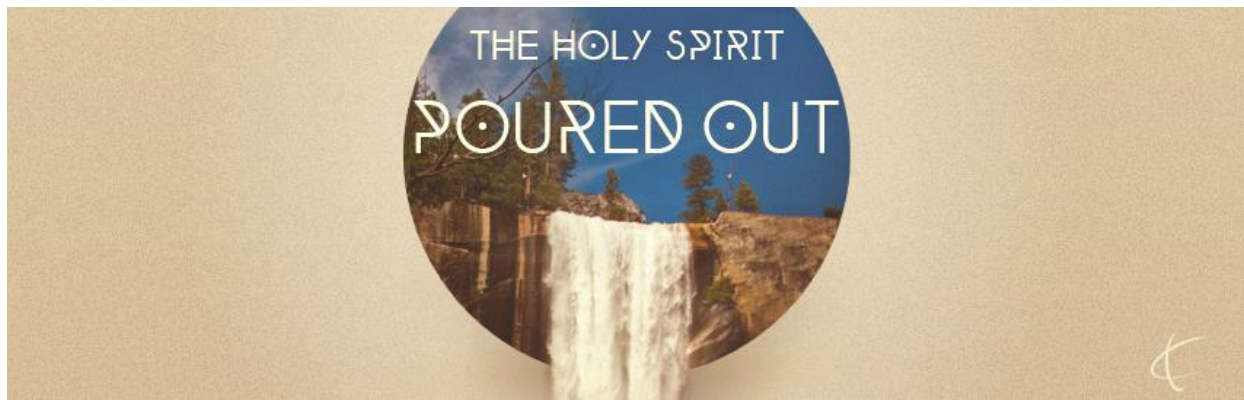


## DISCUSSION QUESTIONS



*These discussion questions are designed to extend the impact of the Sunday message. You can use them for your personal Bible study, family study, and/or small group study.*

### Overview

Sermon: *Poured Into*

*And hope does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit, who has been given to us. - Romans 5:5*

God poured out his Spirit on his people on the day of Pentecost. When he poured out his Spirit, he poured into our hearts faith, hope, and love. God's love poured into us through his Spirit is the fuel for following Jesus. Love is what compels us to share the gospel and serve others.

God wants to pour out his Spirit through the Holy Spirit so that you can pour out his love on others.

### Discussion

1. Describe God's love for you. What makes his love supreme?
2. Read Romans 5:1-8. How does the love of God poured into our hearts by the Spirit allow us to have hope and peace amidst suffering? How does God demonstrate his love for us? What can we learn from this?
3. How does Jesus' baptism in Mark 1:9-11 allow us to see God's love being poured out on Him through the Spirit? How is this a picture of God's love for us in our baptism?
4. Read Romans 8:31-39. How does God choose to love us lavishly, deeply, powerfully, and securely? How does his love for us give us confidence in him?
5. How is God's love poured into our hearts the catalyst for mission?

### Application

6. Where do you need more of God's love in your life that only the Spirit can provide?
7. Spend time praying for God's overflowing love to pour into your heart and the church.
