Overview

Sermon: ONE Hope

Discussion

- 1. How would you describe the difference between how someone might describe hope without the presence of God and hope finding its source in God? How is hope in God more than just wishful thinking?
- 2. Praying in faith can be described as believing that God has done it. Likewise, praying in hope can be described as believing God will do it. How is hope based in the evidence of what God has already done?
- 3. Have you ever been in a place where your hope was dried up and God made good on your behalf at just the right time? Share your story with the group. How do you see God at work in your story? How has your experience of God's grace aided in your own ability in trusting in Jesus and loving your neighbor?
- 4. Share with the group some biblical characters that seemed to never give up hope. What can we learn from them about perseverance? Who is someone today that embodies this same kind of hope?

Application

- 5. Is there some area in your life where you need the hope of God? Share with the group.
- 6. Pray Romans 15:13 over one another so that "you will overflow with confident hope through the power of the Spirit."
