The Book of Galatians / Galatians 1:10-24

The Source

Galatians 1:10–12 NASB95

For am I now seeking the favor of men, or of God? Or am I striving to please men? If I were still trying to please men, I would not be a bond-servant of Christ. For I would have you know, brethren, that the gospel which was preached by me is not according to man. For I neither received it from man, nor was I taught it, but *I received it* through a revelation of Jesus Christ.

Please - ἀρέσκω (areskō): vb.; ≡ Str 700; TDNT 1.455—LN 25.90 please, accommodate (Mt 14:6; Mk 6:22; Ac 6:5; Ro 15:1; 1Co 7:32; 10:33; Gal 1:10; 1Th 2:4; 4:1; 2Ti 2:4)

Bond-Servant - δοῦλος (doulos), ου (ou), ὁ (ho): n.masc.; ≡ DBLHebr 6269; Str 1401 & 1400; TDNT 2.261—LN 87.76 slave, servant (Mt 8:9; Mk 10:44; Jn 8:34; 15:15; Ro 6:20; 1Co 7:21; Gal 3:28; Eph 6:5; 1Ti 6:1; Philemon 16) *When Paul speaks of himself as a slave of Jesus Christ or of God in Ro 1:1, Ga 1:10, and Tt 1:1, the term δοῦλος focuses attention primarily upon his belonging to Christ or to God.*

Gospel - εὐαγγέλιον (euangelion), ου (ou), τό (to): n.neu.; ≡ DBLHebr 1415; Str 2098; TDNT 2.721—LN 33.217 the good news, gospel (Mt 4:23; Mk 1:1; Ac 15:7; 20:24; Ro 1:16;

2:16; 10:16; 1Co 15:1; 2Co 4:3; Gal 1:6; Eph 1:13; 3:6; 6:19; Php 1:27; 1Th 1:5; 1Ti 1:11; 2Ti 2:8; Rev 14:6; Mk 16:15 v.r.)

Revelation - ἀποκάλυψις (apokalypsis), εως (eōs), ἡ (hē): n.fem.; ≡ Str 602; TDNT 3.563—LN 28.38 revelation, what is revealed, a disclosure (<u>Lk 2:32</u>; <u>Ro 16:25</u>; <u>1Co 1:7</u>; <u>14:6</u>; 2Co 12:1; Gal 1:12; Eph 1:17; 2Th 1:7; 1Pe 1:7; Rev 1:1)

1 Corinthians 3:4-5 NASB95

For when one says, "I am of Paul," and another, "I am of Apollos," are you not *mere* men? What then is Apollos? And what is Paul? Servants through whom you believed, even as the Lord gave *opportunity* to each one.

My Pedigree

Galatians 1:13–17 NASB95

For you have heard of my former manner of life in Judaism, how I used to persecute the church of God beyond measure and tried to destroy it; and I was advancing in Judaism beyond many of my contemporaries among my countrymen, being more extremely zealous for my ancestral traditions. But when God, who had set me apart *even* from my mother's womb and called me through His grace, was pleased to reveal His Son in me so that I might preach Him among the Gentiles, I did not immediately consult with flesh and blood, nor did I go up to Jerusalem to those who were apostles before me; but I went away to Arabia, and returned once more to Damascus.

Being Acquainted

Galatians 1:18–24 NASB95

Then three years later I went up to Jerusalem to become acquainted with Cephas, and stayed with him fifteen days. But I did not see any other of the apostles except James, the Lord's brother. (Now in what I am writing to you, I assure you before God that I am not lying.) Then I went into the regions of Syria and Cilicia. I was *still* unknown by sight to the churches of Judea which were in Christ; but only, they kept hearing, "He who once persecuted us is now preaching the faith which he once tried to destroy." And they were glorifying God because of me.

Acquainted - iστορέω (historeō): vb.; ≡ Str 2477; TDNT 3.391—LN 34.52 visit and get information, get acquainted with (Gal 1:18+; Ac 17:23)
