An office under the New Covenant established by God Almighty at the birth of the Church. Christ the Lord being the Head of the Church. Referred to also as his "body"

Ephesians 1:22-23 - 22 And God hath placed all things under his feet, and gave him to be the **head** over all things to the church, 23 Which is his **body**, the fulness of him that filleth all in all.

Colossians 1:18 And he (Jesus) is the head of the body, the church: who is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead; that in all things he might have the preeminence (supremacy).

Eph 4:11 KJV - 11 And he gave some, apostles; and some, prophets; and some, evangelists; and some, pastors and teachers;

1Co 12:28 KJV - 28 And God hath set some in the church, first apostles, secondarily prophets, thirdly teachers, after that miracles, then gifts of healings, helps, governments, diversities of tongues.

The Office of the Prophet is set to advance the Lord's agenda in the earth: to foretell of future events before they occur and/or to speak the mind of God in a particular situation. Reproving (correcting), admonishing (warning), encouraging, building up, revealing hidden things etc.

Can be to family, friends, churches, cities, regions, nations.

Rev 19:10 KJV - 10 And I fell at his feet to worship him. And he said unto me, See thou do it not: I am thy fellowservant, and of thy brethren that have the testimony of Jesus: worship God: for the testimony of Jesus is the spirit of prophecy.
