HERMENEUTICS

Hermeneutics is the practice of interpretation

Interpretation Case Study

Interpretation 1:

Mary owned a small lamb

Interpretation 2:

Mary owned a young lamb

Interpretation 3:

Mary once had a lamb, but not anymore

Interpretation 4:

Mary, mother of Jesus, gave birth to the "lamb" of God

Interpretation 5:

Mary ate a small portion of lamb meat

Interpretation 6:

Mary is a lamb and gave birth to a newborn lamb

Interpretation 7:

Mary scammed a small lamb



5 Step Procedure to Interpreting Scripture

1. Identify the genre

- Law, History, Poetry/Wisdom, Prophets, Narratives, Epistles, Apocalypse

2. State your initial understanding of the passage

- Based on what you observe, know, think, and receive from the Holy Spirit

3. Make observations about the following contexts

- Literary (requires research)
- Cultural (requires research)
- Historical (requires research)

4. Interpret the meaning of the passage

What's the big idea / main point?

5. Apply the passage to your life and to those around you

- What does God want me to do with this?

Matthew 28:18-20

¹⁸ And Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. ¹⁹ Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, ²⁰ teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

Proverbs 25:21-22

- ²¹ If your enemy is hungry, give him bread to eat, and if he is thirsty, give him water to drink,
- ²² for you will heap burning coals on his head, and the LORD will reward you.

James 2:14-17

¹⁴ What good is it, my brothers, if someone says he has faith but does not have works? Can that faith save him? ¹⁵ If a brother or sister is poorly clothed and lacking in daily food, ¹⁶ and one of you says to them, "Go in peace, be warmed and filled," without giving them the things needed for the body, what good is that? ¹⁷ So also faith by itself, if it does not have works, is dead.

Romans 5:18-19

¹⁸ Therefore, as one trespass led to condemnation for all men, so one act of righteousness leads to justification and life for all men. ¹⁹ For as by the one man's disobedience the many were made sinners, so by the one man's obedience the many will be made righteous.
