Small Group Guide: The Promise of the Coming King

Key Takeaways:

- 1. God has a plan for redemption, even in times of discipline and exile.

Discussion Questions:

- 1. The sermon began with an analogy about an MRI experience. How does this relate to our spiritual lives and times when we feel confined or uncomfortable?
- 2. Micah prophesies about a ruler coming from Bethlehem. How does this prophecy point to Jesus, and why is the fulfillment of prophecy important for our faith?
- 3. The sermon mentions that God often uses small, insignificant things for His purposes. Can you share an example from your own life where God used something seemingly small to make a big impact?
- 4. How does the idea of God "purging" Israel relate to our own spiritual growth? Have you experienced a time when God removed something from your life for your own good?
- 5. The pastor talked about idols in our lives. What are some modern-day idols that people, including Christians, might struggle with?
- 6. How does the promise of Christ's return impact how we should live our daily lives?

Practical Applications:

- 1. Self-reflection: Take time this week to "follow the trail" of where you spend your time, money, and energy. What does this reveal about your priorities and potential idols?
- 2. Scripture memorization: Choose one of the verses mentioned in the sermon (e.g., Micah 5:2 or 1 Thessalonians 4:16-18) to memorize this week.
- 3. Watchfulness: Practice being more aware of God's work in your life and in the world around you. Keep a journal of ways you see God moving or answering prayer.
- 4. Sharing hope: Look for an opportunity to share the hope of Christ's return with someone who may be struggling or feeling hopeless.
- 5. Prayer focus: Spend time each day this week praying for the persecuted church and for Jews to come to know Jesus as their Messiah.
- 6. Community action: Discuss as a group how you can be "salt and light" in your local community, putting into practice the call to be ready for Christ's return.
