Small Group Guide: Blessed are the Merciful

Opening Question:

Share a time when someone showed you unexpected mercy or forgiveness. How did it impact you?

Key Takeaways:

Discussion Questions:

- 4. How can showing mercy be challenging in our daily lives? Share specific examples.
- 5. The sermon emphasized loving our enemies and praying for those who persecute us. How can we practically apply this teaching?
- 6. How does extending mercy free us from emotional "imprisonment"?
- 7. Discuss the statement: "We're not meant to control our Christianity. Our Christianity is meant to control us." What does this mean in the context of showing mercy?

Practical Applications:

- 1. Practice the "1-2-3" approach mentioned in the sermon: Kind, Tenderhearted, Forgiving. Try applying this in a challenging relationship or situation this week.
- 2. Identify someone who has wronged you or someone you struggle to forgive. Commit to praying for them daily this week.
- 3. Write a prayer request for someone who needs God's mercy and place it on the church prayer wall.
- 4. Reflect on areas in your life where you may be withholding mercy. Ask God to help you release those situations to Him.
- 5. Look for an opportunity to show unexpected mercy to someone this week, whether at work, in your family, or in your community.
