Small Group Guide: Hunger and Thirst for Righteousness

Opening Question: What's something you've been really hungry or thirsty for recently? How did that feeling drive your actions?

Key Scripture: Matthew 5:6 "Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they shall be satisfied."

Discussion Questions:

- 1. The pastor mentions that God has "put eternity in our hearts" (Ecclesiastes 3:11). How have you experienced this longing for something more in your own life?
- 2. How does the world often try to fill the God-shaped hole in our hearts? What are some things people commonly pursue instead of God?
- 3. The sermon discusses the story of the woman at the well (John 4). How does Jesus' offer of "living water" relate to our spiritual hunger and thirst?
- 4. What does it mean to hunger and thirst for righteousness? How is this different from trying to earn righteousness through our own efforts?
- 5. The pastor talks about "imputed righteousness" through Christ. How does understanding this concept change our approach to pursuing God?
- 6. How might our lives look different if we truly sought God's kingdom and righteousness first (Matthew 6:33)?

Key Takeaways:

1. True satisfaction can only be found in a relationship with God, not in worldly pursuits.

- 2. Hungering and thirsting for righteousness is about desiring a deep relationship with God, not just trying to be "good enough."
- 3. Our righteousness comes from Christ, not our own efforts.
- 4. Pursuing God wholeheartedly leads to satisfaction and provision in other areas of life.

Practical Applications:

- 1. Daily Prayer: Spend time each day asking God to increase your hunger and thirst for Him.
- 2. Scripture Meditation: Choose a verse or passage about God's righteousness to meditate on throughout the week.
- 3. Fasting: Consider fasting from a meal or activity this week to focus on your spiritual hunger for God.
- 4. Accountability: Share with a partner one area where you want to pursue God's righteousness more intentionally.
