Small Group Guide: Seeing God with a Pure Heart

Opening Prayer: Begin the session with a prayer, asking God to open hearts and minds to understand His word and see Him more clearly.

Key Takeaways:

- 1. A pure heart is necessary to see God.
- 2. Our heart condition often prevents us from truly seeing God.
- 3. Seeing God is a progressive revelation that grows as we trust Him more.
- 4. Jesus came to reveal the nature of God to us in human form.
- 5. Loving God and others helps us see God more clearly.

Discussion Questions:

- 1. What does it mean to have a "pure heart" according to the sermon? How is this different from trying to be perfect through our own efforts?
- 2. The pastor mentioned that our heart is often "deceitful" and "sick." Can you share an example of how you've experienced this in your own life?
- 3. How does Jesus help us see God more clearly? Discuss some examples from the Gospels.
- 4. The sermon talks about "progressive revelation" of God. Can you describe a time in your life when your understanding of God grew or changed?
- 5. How does loving others relate to our ability to see God? Why do you think this connection exists?
- 6. Reflect on the story of Job. How did his trials ultimately lead him to see God more clearly? What can we learn from his experience?
- 7. What are some practical ways we can "turn towards the light" in our daily lives, even when it's uncomfortable?

Practical Applications:

- 1. Daily Heart Check: Spend a few minutes each day this week examining your heart. Ask God to reveal areas that need purifying.
- 2. Light-Seeking Challenge: Identify one area of your life where you tend to "turn from the light." Commit to bringing that area before God in prayer and seeking His guidance.
- 3. Love in Action: Choose one practical way to show love to someone else this week, remembering that loving others helps us see God more clearly.
- 4. Scripture Meditation: Spend time meditating on Psalm 51:10 ("Create in me a clean heart, O God") and journaling about what a "clean heart" might look like in your life.

Closing Prayer: End the session by praying for each other, asking God to purify hearts and open eyes to see Him more clearly in the coming week.
