AMPLIFIED—As the Lord Wills Pastor Logan Ames

Isaiah 53:10 (NIV) — "Yet it was the Lord's will to crush Him and cause Him to suffer, and though the Lord makes His life an offering for sin, He will see His offspring and prolong His days, and the will of the Lord will prosper in His hand".

1 Peter 4:19 (ESV) — "Therefore, let those who suffer according to God's will entrust their souls to a faithful Creator while doing good".

Matthew 13:22 (NIV) — "The seed falling among the thorns refers to someone who hears the word, but the worries of this life and the deceitfulness of wealth choke the word, making it unfruitful".

Acts 18:9-11 (AMP) — One night the Lord said to Paul in a vision, "Do not be afraid anymore, but go on speaking and do not be silent; for I am with you, and no one will attack you in order to hurt you, because I have many people in this city".

So he settled there for a year and six months, teaching them the word of God [concerning eternal salvation through faith in Christ].

Acts 18:20-21 (AMP) — When they asked him to stay for a longer time, he refused; but after telling them goodbye and saying, "I will return again if God is willing", he set sail from Ephesus.

Acts 20:8-10 (AMP) — "Now there were many lamps in the upper room where we were assembled, and there was a young man named Eutychus ('Lucky') sitting on the window sill. He was sinking into a deep sleep, and as Paul kept on talking longer and longer, he was completely overcome by sleep and fell down from the third story; and he was picked up dead. But Paul went down and threw himself on him and embrace him, and said [to those standing around him], 'Do not be troubled, because he is alive".

Acts 20:22-24 (AMP) — "And now, compelled by the Spirit and obligated by my convictions, I am going to Jerusalem, not knowing what will happen to me there, except that the Holy Spirit solemnly [and emphatically] affirms to me in city after city that imprisonment and suffering await me. But I do not consider my life as something of value or dear to me, so that I may [with joy] finish my course and the ministry which I received from the Lord Jesus, to testify faithfully of the good news of God's [precious, undeserved] grace [which makes us free of the guilt of sin and grants us eternal life]".

Luke 22:39-43 (NIV) — Jesus went out as usual to the Mount of Olives, and His disciples followed Him. On reaching the place, He said to them, "Pray that you will not fall into temptation". He withdrew about a stone's throw beyond them, knelt down and prayed, "Father, if you are willing, take this cup from me; yet not my will, but yours be done". An angel from heaven appeared to Him and strengthened Him.

Acts 20:25-28 (AMP) — "And now, listen carefully: I know that none of you, among whom I went about preaching the kingdom, will see me again. For that reason, I testify to you on this [our parting] day that I am innocent of the blood of all people. For I did not shrink from declaring to you the whole purpose and plan of God. Take care and be on guard for yourselves and for the whole flock over which the Holy Spirit has appointed you as overseers, to shepherd (tend, feed, guide) the church of God, which He bought with His own blood".

Acts 21:1 (AMP) — "When we had torn ourselves away from them and set sail, we ran a straight course and came to Cos, and on the next day to Rhodes, and from there to Patara".

Acts 21:10-11 (AMP) — As we were staying there for some time, a prophet named Agabus came down from Judea. And coming to [see] us, he took Paul's [wide] band (belt, sash) and bound his own feet and hands, and said, "This is what the Holy Spirit says: 'In this same way the Jews in Jerusalem will bind the man who owns this band, and they will hand him over to the Gentiles (pagans)".

Acts 21:12-14 (AMP) — Now when we had heard this, both we and the local residents began pleading with Paul trying to persuade him not to go up to Jerusalem.

Then Paul replied, "What are you doing, weeping and breaking my heart [like this]?

For I am ready not only to be bound and imprisoned, but even to die at Jerusalem for the name of the Lord Jesus". And since he would not be dissuaded, we stopped pleading and fell silent, saying, "The Lord's will be done!"

Bottom Line - Key Points

- 1. We cannot say "as the Lord wills" unless we are ready and willing to accept whatever He decides.
- 2. The problem isn't too much suffering, but that we are too ignorant about the glory of heaven.
- 3. Let go of your own will, even tearing yourself away from those who promote it, and trust in Him.
