AMPLIFIED—Unchained Pastor Logan Ames

2 Timothy 1:6-8 (NIV) — "For this reason I remind you to fan into flame the gift of God, which is in you through the laying on of my hands. For the Spirit God gave us does not make us timid, but gives us power, love, and self-discipline. So do not be ashamed of the testimony about our Lord or of me His prisoner. Rather, join with me in suffering for the gospel, by the power of God".

Philippians 1:20-21 (NIV) — "I eagerly expect and hope that I will in no way be ashamed, but will have sufficient courage so that now as always Christ will be exalted in my body, whether by life or by death. For me, to live is Christ and to die is gain".

Acts 12:1-4 (AMP) — "Now at that time, Herod [Agrippa I] the king [of the Jews] arrested some who belonged to the church, intending to harm them. And he had James the brother of John put to death with a sword; and when he saw that it pleased the Jews, he proceeded to have Peter arrested as well. This was during the days of Unleavened Bread [the Passover week]. When he had seized Peter, he put him in prison, turning him over to four squads of soldiers of four each to guard him [in rotation throughout the night], planning after the Passover to bring him out before the Passover [for execution]".

Colossians 2:13-15 (NIV) — "When you were dead in your sins and in the uncircumcision of your flesh, God made you alive with Christ. He forgave us all our sins, having canceled the charge of our legal indebtedness, which stood against us and condemned us; He has taken it away, nailing it to the cross. And having disarmed the powers and authorities, He made a public spectacle of them, triumphing over them by the cross".

Mark 10:39-40 (NLT) — "Oh yes", they replied, "we are able!" Then Jesus told them, "You will indeed drink from my bitter cup and be baptized with my baptism of suffering. But I have no right to say who will sit on my right or my left. God has prepared those places for the ones He has chosen".

Acts 12:5 (AMP) - "So Peter was kept in prison, but fervent and persistent prayer for him was being made to God by the church".

"fervently" = Greek ektenos - "from a medical term describing the stretching of a muscle to its limits"

Acts 12:6-11 (AMP) — The very night before Herod was to bring him forward, Peter was sleeping between two soldiers, bound with two chains, and sentries were in front of the door guarding the prison. Suddenly, an angel of the Lord appeared [beside him] and a light shone in the cell. The angel struck Peter's side and awakened him, saying, "Get up quickly!" And the chains fell off his hands. The angel said to him, "Prepare yourself and strap on your sandals [to get ready for whatever may happen]". And he did so. Then the angel told him, "Put on your robe and follow me".

And Peter went out following the angel. He did not realize that what was being done by the angel was real, but thought he was seeing a vision. When they had passed the first guard and the second,

vas real, but thought he was seeing a vision. When they had passed the first guard and the second they came to the iron gate that leads into the city. Of its own accord it swung open for them; and they went out and went along one street, and at once the angel left him. When Peter came to his senses, he said, "Now I know for certain that the Lord has sent His angel and has rescued me from the hand of Herod and from all that the Jewish people were expecting [to do to me]".

1 Samuel 17:34-37 (NIV) — But David said to Saul, "Your servant has been keeping his father's sheep. When a lion or a bear came and carried off a sheep from the flock, I went after it, struck it, and rescued the sheep from its mouth. When it turned on me, I seized it by its hair, struck it and killed it. Your servant has killed both the lion and the bear; this uncircumcised Philistine will be like one of them, because he has defied the armies of the living God. The Lord who rescued me from the paw of the lion and the paw of the bear will rescue me from the hand of this Philistine".

Acts 12:12-17 (AMP) — "When he realized what had happened, he went to the house of Mary the mother of John, who was also called Mark, where many [believers] were gathered together and were praying continually [and had been praying all night]. When he knocked at the door of the gateway, a servant-girl named Rhoda came to answer. Recognizing Peter's voice, in her joy she failed to open

the gate, but ran in and announced that Peter was standing in front of the gateway.

They said to her, 'You are out of your mind!" But she kept insisting that it was so.

They kept saying, 'It is his angel!' But [meanwhile] Peter continued knocking; and when they opened the door and saw him, they were completely amazed. But motioning to them with his hand to be quiet and listen, he described how the Lord had led him out of the prison. And he said, 'Report these things to James and the brothers and sisters'. Then he left and went to another place".

Galatians 5:1 (NIV) — "It is for freedom that Christ has set us free. Stand firm, then, and do not let yourselves be burdened again by a yoke of slavery".

Galatians 5:1 (MSG) — "Christ has set us free to live a free life. So take your stand! Never again let anyone put a harness of slavery on you".

1 Corinthians 5:7-8 (NIV) — "Get rid of the old yeast, so that you may be a new unleavened batch — as you really are. For Christ, our Passover lamb, has been sacrificed. Therefore, let us keep the Festival, not with the old bread leavened with malice and wickedness, but with the unleavened bread of sincerity and truth".

Bottom Line - Key Points

- 1. Fear, worry, and a need to secure comfort and avoid pain are all chains the devil uses to hold us down.
- 2. When the church has no human answer to the chains placed on us, prayer to God gives us all we need.
- 3. Even a small bit of faith in a great God is enough to resist the chains and stand firm in His sacrifice.
