






Jesus Christ our Great High Priest

Therefore, since we have a great high priest who has ascended into heaven, Jesus the son of God, let us hold firmly to the faith we profess. ¹⁵ For we do not have a high priest who is unable to feel sympathy for our weaknesses, but we have one who has been tempted in every way, just as we are - yet he did not sin. ¹⁶ Let us then approach God's throne of grace with confidence so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help us in our time of need. Hebrews 7:14 -16



Then the Lord God took the man and put him in the garden to tend and keep it. Genesis 2:15

¹⁸ Then Melchizedek king of Salem brought out bread and wine; he was the priest of God Most High. ¹⁹ And he blessed him and said:

•16 Now when the Sabbath was past, Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought spices, that they might come and anoint Him. ² Very early in the morning, on the first day of the week, they came to the tomb when the sun had risen. ³ And they said among themselves, "Who will roll away the stone from the door of the tomb for us?" 4 But when they looked up, they saw that the stone had been rolled away—for it was very large. 5 And entering the tomb, they saw a young man clothed in a long white robe sitting on the right side; and they were alarmed. Jesus is our mediator. ⁵ For *there is* one God and one Mediator between God and men, *the* Man Christ Jesus, 1 Timothy 2:5

Jesus is our intercessor.

Therefore He is also able to save ^[a] to the uttermost those who come to God through Him, since He always lives to make intercession for them. Hebrews 7:25

Jesus has taken his place at the right hand of God. ² looking unto Jesus, the ^[a] author and ^[b] finisher of *our* faith, who for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and has sat down at the right hand of the throne of God. Hebrews 12:2

Jesus calls his followers to take their rightful place as a royal priesthood.

⁹ But you are a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, His own special people, that you may proclaim the praises of Him who called you out of darkness into His marvellous light; ¹⁰ who once were not a people but are now the people of God, who had not obtained mercy but now have obtained mercy. **1**

Peter 2:9-10

- Priests offered animal sacrifices and offerings on behalf of the people, making atonement for their sins, pronouncing them clean from disease and restoring them to a fit state for relationship with God.
- They served as intercessors, seeking forgiveness and blessing from God on behalf of the people.
- Priests looked after the temple.
- They were responsible for teaching God's law and guiding the people in matters of faith and practice.
- The old Testament priesthood pointed towards the ultimate high priest, Jesus Christ, who offered himself as the final sacrifice for all humanity.

I beseech^[a] you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that you present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable to God, *which is* your ^[b] reasonable service. Romans 12:1
