## Every Spiritual Blessing Part 3 In the Beloved We Have Hope Ephesians 1:8-10

**Introduction:** According to the Joshua Project, 7400 people groups which make up 42% of the Worlds population are considered unreached. This means that less than 2% claim to be Christ followers. This is made up of 7,400 people groups, of these, 3,000 of them are considered unengaged. This is defined as having no missionaries, no outreach, no church, and no Christian materials. 1,800 of these have absolutely no Scripture at all whatsoever. What we take for granted, the multiple copies of the Bible in our homes, is not even a possibility for a large percentage of people even in the 21st century. Our passage this morning focuses on the blessing associated with having and comprehending God's revelation to us. May we never take it for granted for in it we find great hope!
