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I.	Secular hope defined-(noun) The object of ones desires, wishes, longings or even expectations apart from a direct promise of God. (Acts 16:19; I Cor. 9:10; Philippians 1:20)
II.	Divine hope defined- (noun) All promises of God yet to be fulfilled as they relate to the people they were promised to. (Titus 2:13; I John 3:3)
	The "Grace of hope" (coined by Spurgeon) defined- (Hopefulness)- (The verb, noun with modifiers) The level of longing, confidence or expectation that an individual places in the object of their hope. (Hebrews 6:11)
