

**Title:** The Parable of the Weeds **Scripture:** Matthew 13:24-30

**Main Idea:** Jesus teaches us that God has planted us as good seed in His field, even though weeds of evil grow alongside us. Our call is to trust the good Farmer, live out our God-given purpose, and tend our portion faithfully while we await the harvest.

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**Point 1: You Are Good Seed (v.24)**

- Jesus says the farmer sows *good seed*. A commentary notes: good seed is the right seed for the right purpose.
  - God is a wise farmer. He planted you where He wants you.
  - Truth: You are chosen and designed by God with a purpose.
  - Challenge: Stop doubting your value. Live with the expectation that God wants to use you.
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**Point 2: Weeds Are Sown by the Enemy (vv.25-30)**

- Evil and hardship are not from God but sown by the enemy to frustrate and discourage.
  - We see this in tragedies, sickness, brokenness. It tempts us to blame God.
  - Truth: Evil exists because Satan is real, not because God planted it. We know evil because we have seen God's goodness.
  - Challenge: Trust the good Farmer even when weeds surround you. Resist blaming Him.
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**Point 3: The Harvest Will Come (vv.29-30; Rev. 19)**

- God delays judgment so the wheat is not uprooted too soon.
  - At the harvest, Jesus will deal fully with evil and those who follow it. Justice will be done.
  - Truth: We live in the in-between time—planted but not yet harvested.
  - Challenge: Weed your portion of the field. Pray with your children, forgive your spouse, love your neighbor, work with integrity. Tend your own heart as you await the harvest.
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**Reflection:**

The parable of the weeds explains the life we all live. God has called us with purpose, yet this world is full of weeds. But the weeds are not from Him—they are from the enemy. We need not despair. The good Farmer will one day bring a final harvest, and justice will be done. Until then, soldier on as good seed in His field, faithful in your portion, ready for the day of true harvest.

### **Devotion 1: You Are Good Seed**

*Scripture:* Matthew 13:24 – “The kingdom of heaven is like a man who sowed good seed in his field.”

*Reflection:* Jesus calls us good seed. That means you are not an accident or a mistake. God planted you in this time, in this place, for His purpose. Even when you feel unworthy or insignificant, Jesus says you are chosen, designed, and placed by the good Farmer.

*Challenge:* Write down one way you see God’s purpose in your life right now. Ask Him to remind you daily that you are His good seed planted for His glory.

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### **Devotion 2: The Enemy Sows Weeds**

*Scripture:* Matthew 13:28 – “‘An enemy did this,’ he replied.”

*Reflection:* The weeds in this world—evil, brokenness, suffering—did not come from God. Satan sows them to discourage us, frustrate us, and try to choke out our fruitfulness. When we face hardship, our instinct is to ask, “God, why did You do this?” But Jesus makes it clear: the weeds come from the enemy, not from the good Farmer.

*Challenge:* The next time you face difficulty, pause and remind yourself: “This is not from God. My Father only sows good seed.” Choose to trust His character even in the middle of the weeds.

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### **Devotion 3: Waiting for the Harvest**

*Scripture:* Matthew 13:30 – “Let both grow together until the harvest.”

*Reflection:* God will deal with evil at the harvest, but that day has not yet come. Until then, we are called to be faithful where He planted us. You cannot weed the entire field of the world, but you can tend your portion—your heart, your home, your workplace, your neighborhood. Faithfulness in the small things is how we wait well for the harvest.

*Challenge:* Identify one “portion of the field” God has given you—your family, your work, your neighbor—and intentionally do one act of faithfulness there this week.
