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## GRACE GROUP DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

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1. In 1 Peter chapter 1:22 it talks about brotherly love. Tell about a time you or someone else experienced brotherly/sisterly love. What are the biggest daily barriers preventing Christians today from excelling even more with this kind of love?
2. According to 1 Peter 2:2 pure spiritual milk is the means for growing up into salvation. What is meant by this?
3. In 1 Peter 2:4, Why is it significant that Jesus is the cornerstone Peter is talking about in this passage?
4. Can you think of a time when having Jesus as the cornerstone of your life impacted a decision you made?
5. In Verse 5, What spiritual sacrifices is Peter talking about? How does this contrast with the type of sacrifices offered in the Old Testament?
6. In 1 Peter, who is worthy to offer these sacrifices and why is that historically significant? What are the impacts of these sacrifices compared to Old Testament sacrifices?
7. How does the way we, as Christians, experience Christ differ from how nonbelievers experience Christ? Why does Peter say they "stumble" (vs 8)?
8. Of all the things Peter says in this section about our identity as Christians, which is the most meaningful to you and why?
