Romans 12:1-8

Big Idea: We are moving from Paul's thorough description of genuine faith (chapters 1-11) to how that faith gets expressed (chapters 12-15). Paul transitions in a way to make it clear that the only attitudes and actions that please God are those rooted in our experience of His mercies.

- Living differently by thinking rightly
- How transformed thinkers think

GRACE GROUP DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

Romans chapters 12-16 — how the righteous God empowers all those He has declared righteous through faith to express their unique relationship with Him in and through their daily lives.

The Summarizing Exhortation (Romans 12:1-2)

1. The overarching exhortation for Romans 12:1-15:13 is given in the first two verses. These verses are the umbrella under which all that follows is included. What does Paul mean by a “living sacrifice” (Romans 12:1)?
2. In what ways do you struggle most with conformity to the world (Romans 12:2)? What is Paul’s antidote to being conformed to the world (Romans 12:2)? What might this look like in your present daily living?

In Your Specific Functioning Within the Body of Christ (Romans 12:3-8)

3. In Romans 12:3-8, we find one of four New Testament passages addressing spiritual gifts. Skim the others: 1 Corinthians 12:7-10, 1 Corinthians 12:28, and Ephesians 4:11. What similarities and what differences do you observe? What do you perceive to be your own spiritual gifts? What would others say about you?
